For example, you could write: “It’s time to go,” she said. Or you could write: Jillian said, “It’s time to go.” Also, be sure to use quotation marks if you’re writing a direct quote from a source.

The convention for indirect citing depends on the citation style. In MLA in-text citations, you use “qtd. in,” short for “quoted in,” to cite indirectly.

Format quotations of 40 words or more as block quotations: Do not use quotation marks to enclose a block quotation. Start a block quotation on a new line and indent the whole block 0.5 in. from the left margin. Double-space the entire block quotation.

Quotation marks (also known as speech marks, quotes or inverted commas) are used to set off direct speech and quotations. In academic writing, you need to use quotation marks when you quote a source. This includes quotes from published works and primary data such as interviews.

To indicate short quotations (four typed lines or fewer of prose or three lines of verse) in your text, enclose the quotation within double quotation marks. Provide the author and specific page number (in the case of verse, provide line numbers) in the in-text citation, and include a complete reference on the Works Cited page.
